#### 1. Welcome

School council chair, P. Vukovic, welcomed everyone to the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

### 2. Artist Kate

- A. ProGrant: ProGrant funded last year's paint night which was hosted by Artist Kate. The program was to teach communication through art. We have received approval and ProGrant funds to run this program for this school year. The program will allow for 40 families to participate. This program will be run in spring and will require a few more student volunteers.
- B. Proud To Be Me: Is a grant with the funds to be used for a program to empower children. We have received \$1500. The program will be a full school day ½ day discussing History and exploring art and ½ day working on art. Last year, following this program we did an art show in the gym with over 600 paintings displayed. Each class would receive \$185. It was recommended to apply again this year. The full day program costs \$4,800 and last year school council shared the cost. Artist Kate will run this full day during the beginning of 2018 school year. K. Kirkwood will apply for the Proud To Be Me in November for the 2018/2019 school year.

## 3. Treasurer Position

Sarah Armstrong self nominated for the position of Treasurer. Sarah introduced and shared her experience with school council.

*Motion:* It was **MOVED** by **CONSENSUS** that S. Armstrong be elected as Treasurer.

#### 4. Chair's Report

• School Council Update/News: S. Reidel will update school lobby white board, K. Bissonnette will continue to monitor GUA school council email but would like to transition to someone next year. Mr. Skinner will update online school calendar with meeting dates at the end of each meeting.

### School Yard Renovation Project

- Teachers were polled to find out their needs.
- Shed with resources: Shed with industrial racks and resources (loose parts, PCP piping, kids can create with, tree cookies, stones, gems, magnifying glasses, clip boards, all in organized bins, any other outdoor items can also be kept in the shed) Shed to be installed before winter. Council to pay for Resources. Heather asked for another \$5,000 towards the project. Peter asking for detailed list of items for the outdoor classroom. Shed must be permanent and follow guidelines. Need to get approval now for shed to be installed before winter. Wait for next meeting and more details to make a vote.
- Mr. Skinner shared his comments and what was done at St. Stephen's. St. Stephen's has trees, mulch area
  and sitting logs, Conversation area, picnic tables, creative wall with chalk boards with music being their
  next direction. The idea of the outdoor classroom is that Teachers can bring students out during nice
  weather and children are allowed to use their outside voices. Having a permanent gym/supply storage
  shed makes it easier for teachers and makes teachers want to use it the outdoor space.
- Mrs. Corbett will look into guidelines and what the board will allow/help with.
- The current outdoor picnic tables have been fixed

#### 5. Treasurer's Report

- Bank Balance as of September 30, 2017 is \$53,295.87
- Cheques/cash for Term 1 Food Programs to be deposited by mid-October, awaiting some final payments prior to full reconciliation
- September PayPal net payments = \$46,942.78, plus \$1,511.92 in PayPal fees
- HST rebate received for \$1,954.02 and deposited to School Account.

- Approval has been granted to split the grade 6 class with 38 students into two classes. Will take time to find new teacher and will be a long process. This will require another portable.

- EQAO results from last year were positive.
- Michelle asked for Council to once again approve support for our sister school, St. Rose of Lima, located in the Bayshore area. Council has supported them each Fall with a \$2500 donation.

*Motion:* It was **MOVED** by P. Vukovic and **SECONDED** by J. Cantley to provide funding to St. Rose of Lima in the amount of \$2,500.

## 11. Food Program Report

• Parents are requesting more food programs. Monique, Shannon and Linda went to Red Gables to try out some new food. Proposal from Red Gables for 4 different styles of pita wraps with veggies for \$3 each which includes delivery, suggested price to parents is \$4.00. Falls under Healthy School Guidelines. A suggestion for a 3 month term to try It – November, December, January – as a pilot (5-6 lunch days). If families like it, could continue into Term 2. Every second Monday is proposed as a pilot option.

*Motion:* It was **MOVED** by **CONSENSUS** that school council will run a trial Red Gables wrap at a cost of \$4, every second Monday starting November and ending January be approved.

  happens during school hours and run seasonally/for a period of time.
- Ms. Corbett agreed to get more information about lunch time programs etc.

- Feedback is more activities for younger kids.
- Mr. Skinner brought sports list Cross Country right now for grade 4, 5, 6. Lacrosse (Nov/Dec),
  Badminton (January), Handball (February), Gymnastics (February), Chuckball (March), Basketball (April ),
